Criteria for Scholarship Application

A scholarship is a financial award that does not have to be repaid. Scholarships are generally awarded based on applicant's meeting certain eligibility criteria (often academic).

All newly admitted freshman are automatically reviewed for scholarships based on SAT scores and class rank.

Returning College of Education and Educational Technology students making application will be considered for each scholarship for which they are eligible, and for which proper documentation is provided. Please refer to the Special Criteria section inside the brochure.

Application Evaluation Process

The College of Education and Educational Technology Scholarship Committee includes representatives from several departments.

Each member reviews and ranks applications.

Applicants are considered for each scholarship for which they are eligible and provide proper documentation.

Students have the right to ask the following:

- What financial aid programs are available to me?
- How does Indiana University of Pennsylvania determine each type and amount of assistance that can be received?
- What are the procedures and deadlines for applying for financial aid?
- How does Indiana University of Pennsylvania determine satisfactory academic progress?

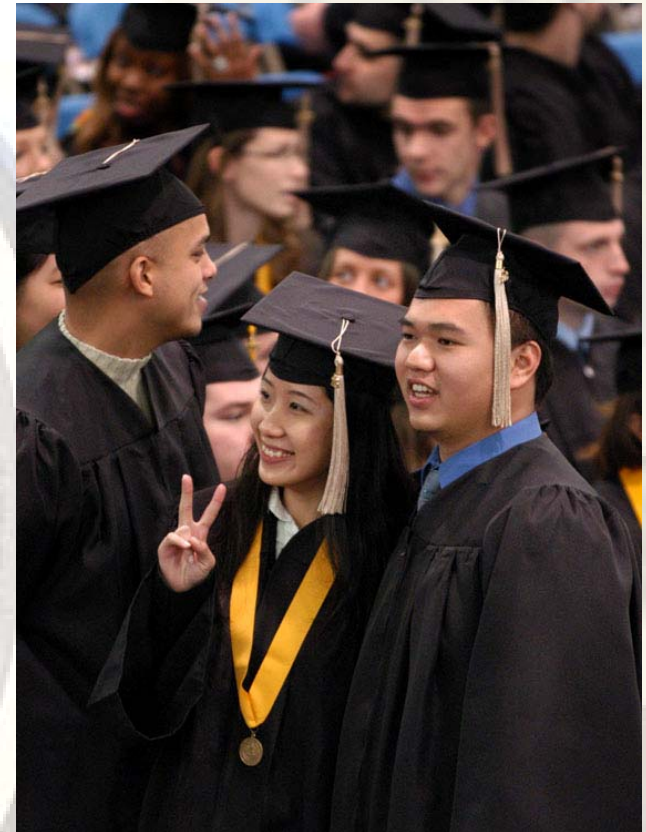
Students are responsible for the following:
